We, the undersigned,
state:

That good, clean and fair food is the inalienable right of everyone and as long as this right is denied to even one person on the planet, we will not stop fighting for it;

That food plays a central role not only in defining the quality of life of individuals and peoples, but also in the history, construction, and evolution of their culture and identity;

That safeguarding the environment is our priority and that promoting the biodiversity of the land and sea and a more sustainable food system are key actions against climate change;

That our everyday choices, starting with what we eat and feed others, can contribute to changing the world and to ensuring a better future for the generations to come;

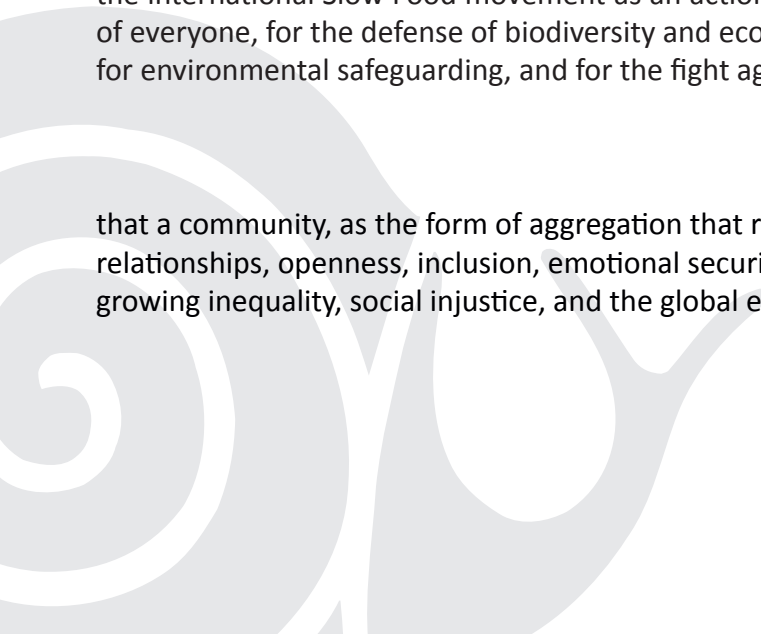
That all people, wherever they are and whatever their circumstances, are able to support Slow Food with ideas, practical support, the dissemination of correct information, a commitment to raising awareness, and sustainable production and consumption choices.

We also recognize

the international Slow Food movement as an action model for the improvement and protection of the lives of everyone, for the defense of biodiversity and ecosystems, for the rebuilding of an ecological food culture, for environmental safeguarding, and for the fight against social and economic iniquities;

And

that a community, as the form of aggregation that represents and promotes a system based on knowledge, relationships, openness, inclusion, emotional security, and democracy, can be part of the solution to growing inequality, social injustice, and the global environmental crisis, and can create real change.



Therefore,

A Slow Food community

- is formed by at least ten people, represented by a spokesperson, and organized by a coordinating group of at least five people;
- is established to pursue a specific objective, linked to the general goals of Slow Food;
- collaborates regularly with the local Slow Food network and produces an annual report for them and Slow Food HQ explaining the activities carried out, those planned for the future, and the main results achieved;
- manages and uses its name and logo in line with the [Slow Food International Statute](#), the [Code of Use for Slow Food Trademarks](#), and the [Fundraising Guidelines](#), and only for the fulfillment of commitments related to its local objectives;
- The Slow Food community is made up of active members, who are educated, informed and updated about the social, cultural and environmental policies of the Slow Food movement. These policies are expressed in activities, projects and national and international campaigns organized by the movement's bodies and by the legal entities through which the movement operates. The spokesperson undertakes to communicate information to members of the community who cannot be directly reached by email by the Slow Food movement's communication and association offices.
- bases its name on its principal activity and the name of the territory in which it operates;
- is committed to being transparent and be managed under a participatory democratic governance model;
- undertakes not to exercise, in the area in which it operates, rights of veto or exclusivity that could hinder new forms of activism and adherence to Slow Food principles by other bodies;
- must create paths for dialogue, sharing, and cooperation with other Slow Food entities, while maintaining the independence and autonomy of each group;
- according to its own circumstances, supports the Slow Food international network and its programs and projects;
- is open, inclusive, and able to welcome people of different backgrounds, incomes, and cultures, and com-mits to encouraging the participation of the widest possible number of people in its activities.

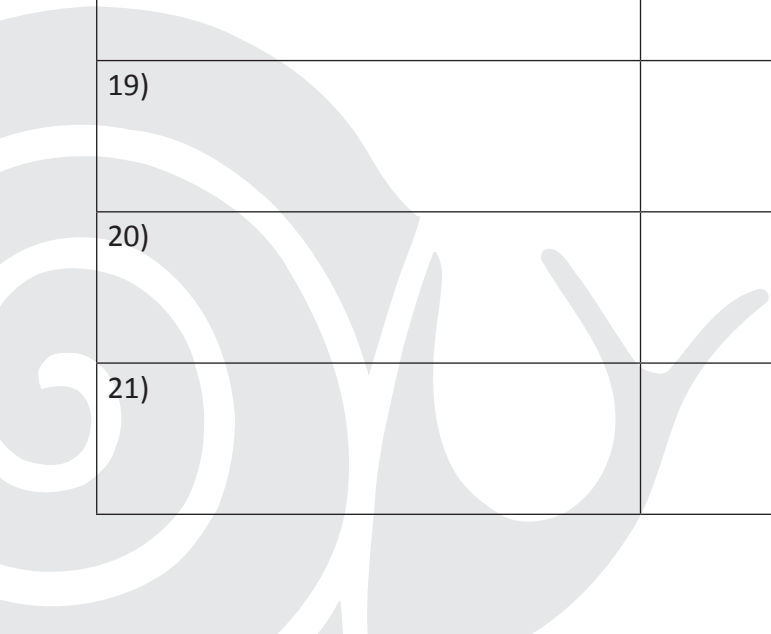

In accordance with Regulation (EU) 2016/679 (GDPR) regarding the processing of personal data, we inform you of the following:

2. SOURCES OF PERSONAL DATA

Personal data can be gathered:

- a) directly from the interested parties and directly and freely supplied by them through the individual compilation of an application to join a community, either printed or online.
- b) from the community spokesperson, through the founding declaration, either printed or in digital format, containing the individual and contact details of the members, directly and freely supplied by them to the spokesperson, who undertakes to transfer the updated and correct data to the Data Controller.

3. PURPOSES OF PROCESSING

The identifying data and emails collected will be used:

- a) to improve participation in the community.
- b) to keep community members updated through communications and newsletters relating to the association or providing information from the Slow Food movement, including from the legal entities through which the movement operates on a national or international level, as well as to ask community members to get involved in campaigns, petitions and activities based on European citizens' initiative rights.

4. OPTIONAL PROVISION OF DATA AND CONSEQUENCES OF REFUSAL

The provision of data is optional.

The willingness to belong to the community, expressed in the founding declaration and subsequent participation, requires the active involvement of members in the community and the legitimate interest of the parties in sending/receiving communications for the purposes expressed in point 3.b.

In the case of refusal to participate in the community, the purposes referenced in points 3.a (improving participation) and 3.b will be unable to be fulfilled.

5. PROCESSING METHODS

Data processing means the collection, recording, organization, storage, elaboration, modification, cancellation and destruction of the data or the combination or two or more such operations. In relation to the purposes referenced above, the processing of personal data can be carried out using manual, computerized and electronic instruments, strictly in relation to said purposes and, in any case, in such a way as to ensure security and privacy. Personal data will be processed in respect of the methods indicated in Regulation (EU) 2016/679 (GDPR), which states, inter alia, that the data must be processed lawfully and correctly, collected and recorded for specific, explicit, legitimate and exact purposes, and if necessary must be updated, relevant, complete and not excessive in relation to the processing purposes, with respect for the minimum security requirements and fundamental rights and freedoms, as well as the dignity of the interested party, with particular reference to privacy and personal identity.

The data will be stored until the end of the legal requirements for defense or legal claims, after the purposes for which the data were collected have expired.

6. CATEGORIES OF SUBJECTS TO WHICH THE DATA CAN BE COMMUNICATED

- (a) Those entrusted with and responsible for processing, whether internal or external to the Controller's organization, who carry out specific tasks and operations.
- (b) Any spokespeople of the community to which the interested party belongs (autonomous controllers).
- (c) In cases provided for by law.

Personal data will not be transferred to recipients in a third country or an international organization outside the European Union (EU) or the European Economic Area (EEA).

7. DURATION OF PROCESSING

- a) The data will be processed for the entire duration of participation in the community and subsequently if authorized as follows.
- b) If a member leaves the community or the community is closed, the interested party will be asked to give specific consent for the preservation of their personal data for archival purposes and for the purposes specified in point 3.b regarding the sending of association-related communications. In the case of authorization, data will be kept until the revocation of consent. In the case of refusal, they will be cancelled or anonymized.

8. RIGHTS OF THE INTERESTED PARTY

At any time the interested party may exercise their rights (to access, rectification, cancellation, restriction, portability, opposition, absence of automated decision-making processes) when stipulated in regards to the Data Controller, pursuant to Articles 15-22 of the GDPR; lodge a complaint with the Data Protection Authority (www.garanteprivacy.it); and, where data processing is based on consent, revoke consent, taking into account the fact that such a revocation will not affect the lawfulness of consent-based data processing that occurred before consent was revoked.
